The next generation of artists

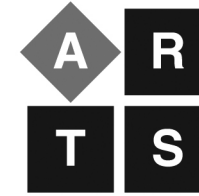

Joseph Eastham is a potter/ceramist. His father is Paul Muth. Paul attended Centre College and remained in Danville working in various service fields. All the while he was creating a well-known body of ceramic work that was both beautiful and functional. He was an active participant in early Farmer's Markets, Gallery Hops, studio tours and festivals. Paul was commis-

sioned to produce awards and gift items. While he no longer lives in Danville, art collectors will recognize a bit of his style on the local scene.

Visitors to Paul's tent years ago would watch as his son, Joseph, at a very young age, would be seated at the potter's wheel turning a bowl or cup.

Today, Joseph is active in the local Farmers' Market, Gallery Hops, street festivals, and the Constitution Square Festival. His work is functional and beautiful with touches of whimsy. You can catch him most weeks at the Farmers' Market in Constitution Square on Saturdays from 9:00 – noon.

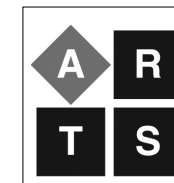

Yes, the weather was great, but that isn't the whole story. A total of 24 host locations opened their doors and sidewalks to nearly 100 artists and community performers all around downtown on May 30th making the unofficial opening of the Brass Band Festival a true community event.

Hundreds of residents and visitors enjoyed meeting several new artists as well as returning favorites. The goal of the Hop is to open opportunities for artists and



hosts to introduce themselves and their work to develop long term business relationships thus building economic opportunity.

Again, a hit of the evening was the performing community groups along the streets. From

student string quartets to young piano students to church choirs and children's acting troupes, the newly renovated sidewalks were alive with entertainment for strollers, shoppers, and diners.
