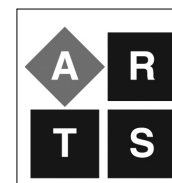

Changes in the Park

Constitution Square is more than the location of the Arts Commission office! It is the actual historic home of the State of Kentucky. The Constitution was written here and Statehood was granted in 1792.

Constitution Square was part of the Kentucky State Park system from 1937 to 2012. In 1942, the 150th anniversary of statehood, the Park was dedicated and named the John G. Weisiger Memorial State Park. At some

point it became known as Constitution Square State Shrine and later Constitution Square State Historic Site. The name was finally changed to Constitution Square Historic Site when the State turned over control of the Park to Boyle County.

The Park continues to attract visitors from all over the country. Yet, its importance in the daily life of the County is significant. Besides the Arts Commission, the Park also houses the
